What's good ?

- Making all stakeholders take responsibility
- The obligation of proportional risk management
- Awareness raising and preparation for sanitary crises
- Taking into account the role played by wildlife



What's worrying ?

- Too unclear implementation (biosecurity, vaccination,...)
- The lack of encouragement for collective and partnership action

Organise: Rapid detection of contaminations and effective reaction need a faultless organisation in all Union.



What's good ?

- The obligation to provide appropriate resources to veterinary services
- Diseases prioritisation



What's worrying ?

- The lack of monitoring networks
- The risk of system's heterogeneity
- The lack of measures for research

Simplify : Simplification of regulatory framework will facilitate the understood of measures, thereby guaranteeing that they will be better applied



What's good ?

- Establishing broad principles which are common to all species
- Recasting the rules which are split in 37 different texts into one single text



What's worrying ?

- The lack of clarity in the implementing texts
