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Paratuberculosis in Germany



- ◆ What is paratuberculosis (Johne's Disease) :
 - Bacterial disease (*Mycobacterium avium* subspecies paratuberculosis (MAP))
 - Infection of calves
 - Adults are infectious (long time before clinical signs)
 - Diarrhea, weight loss, no loss of appetite
 - Diagnostic tests are more or less reliable

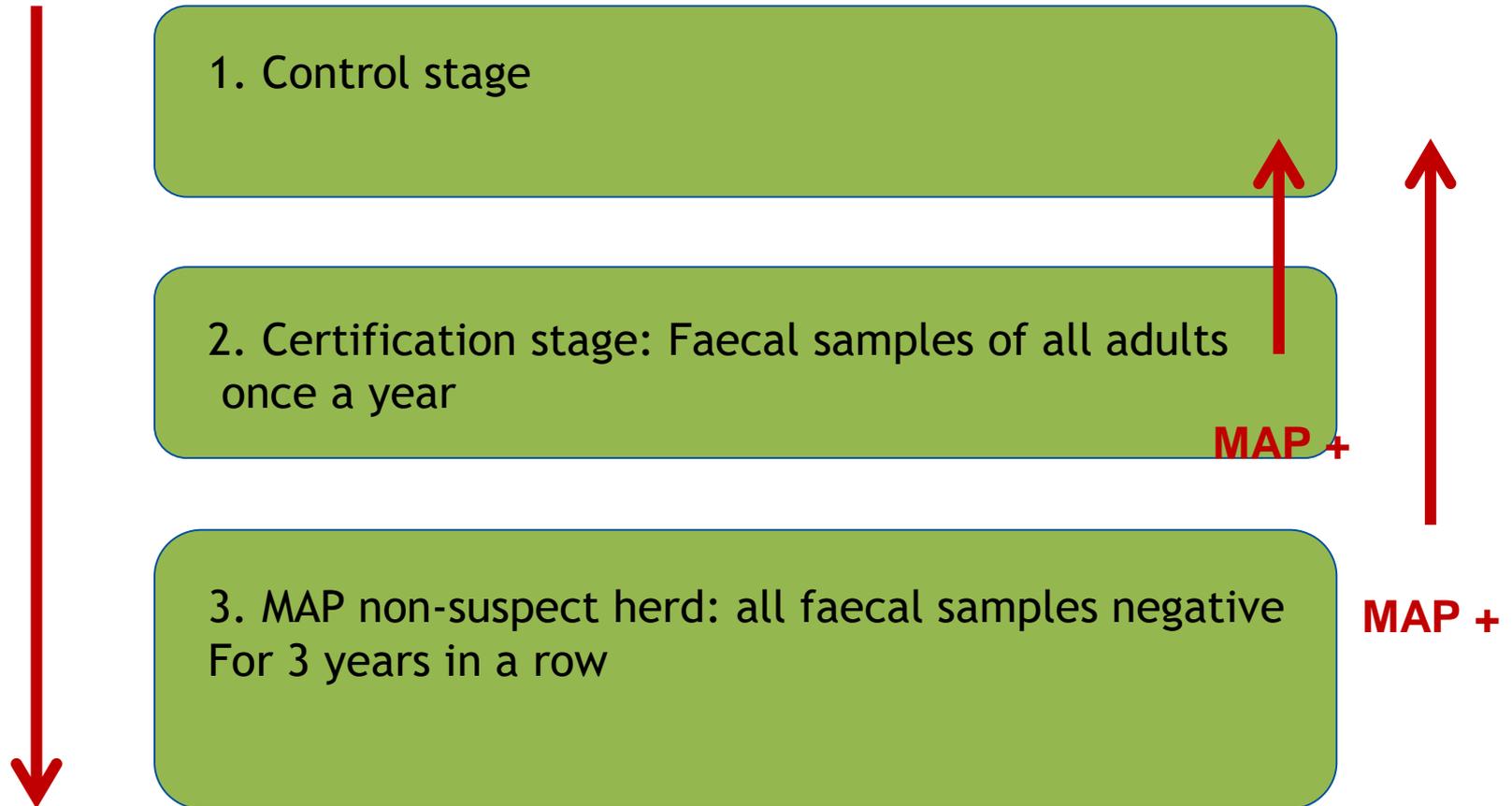

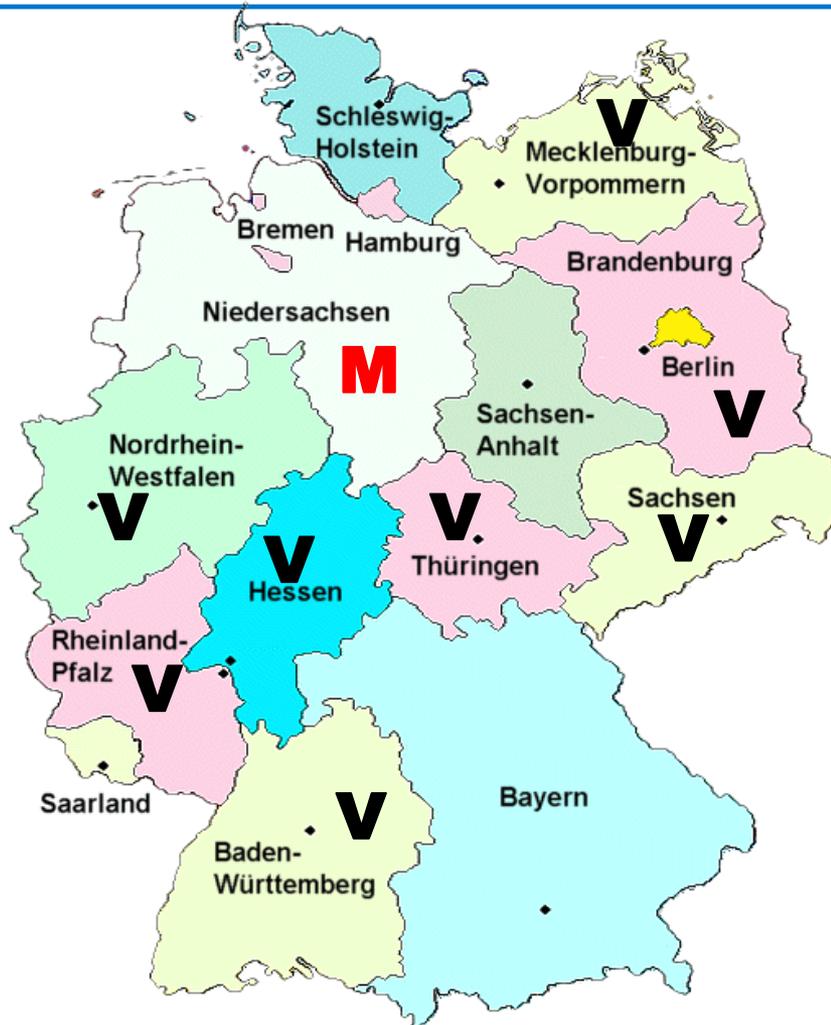

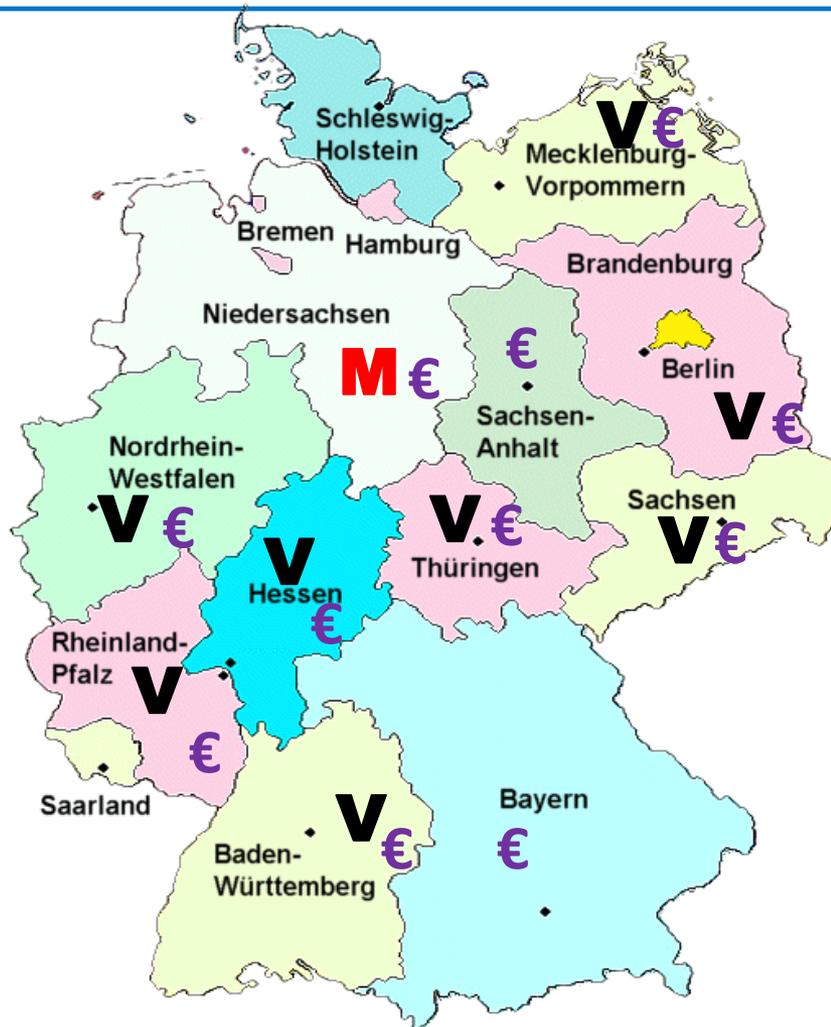


Paratuberculosis in Germany



- Mandatory program (regulation) in 1 federal state
- Voluntary programs in force in 7 federal states
 - formal obligation of the participating farmer
 - different diagnostic approaches

Paratuberculosis in Germany



- Mandatory program (regulation) in 1 federal state
- Voluntary programs in force in 7 federal states
 - formal obligation of the participating farmer
 - different diagnostic approaches
 - Financial aid (regional differences!)
 - Diagnostic tests
 - Compensation for removal of test+ cattle
 - Veterinary advice

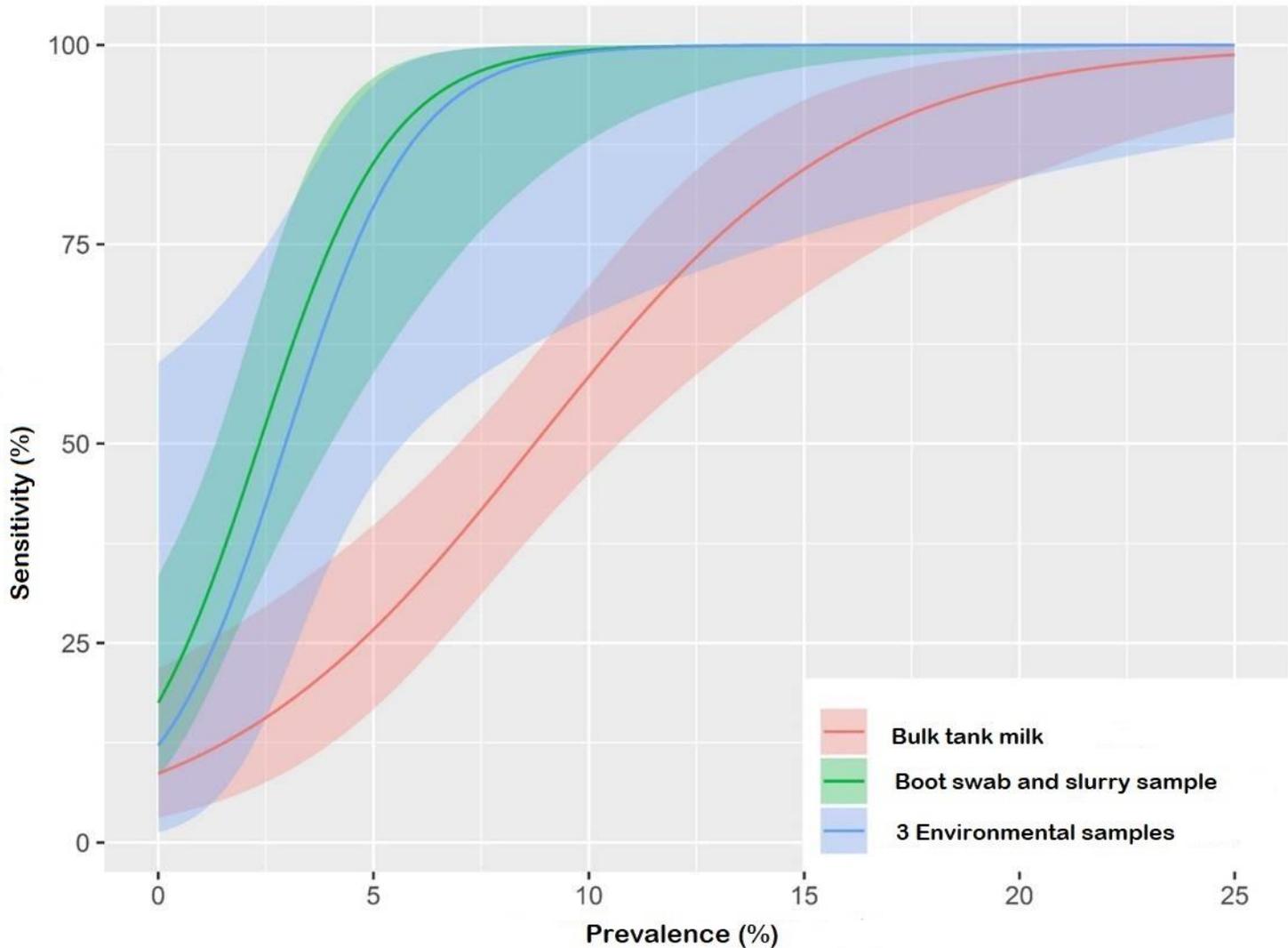
Herd level investigation

Paratuberculosis in Bavaria



Material and methods:

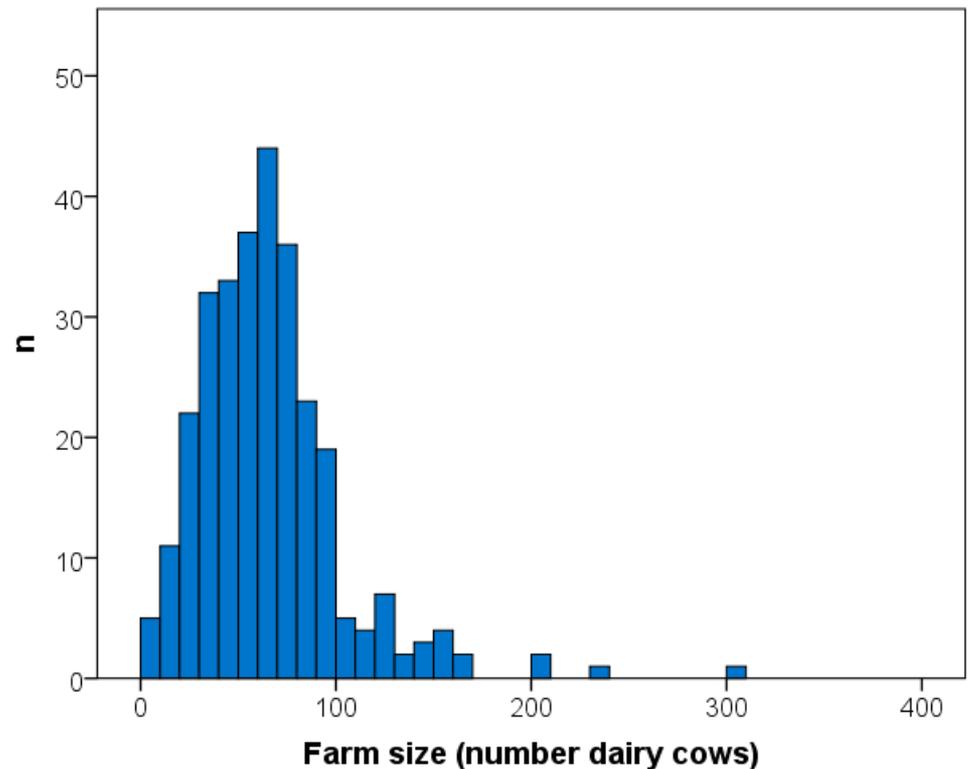
- **Farms:**
 - Regular customers (convenience sample)(Start: February 2017)
 - PraeMAP (randomly selected farms; RS) (Start: August 2017)
- **Samples:**
 - Boot swabs
 - Slurry sample
 - Up to 5 environmental samples
- **Analysis:**
 - Culture
 - Real-time PCR

Paratuberculosis in Bavaria



Preliminary results

- So far complete results from 294 dairy farm
- Farm size: Median 60 dairy cows (Mean: 64/ Bavaria: 39)



Paratuberculosis in Bavaria



Preliminary results

- So far complete results from 294 dairy farm:
 - Convenience sample: 225 (Median farm size: 65 cows)
 - PraeMAP (RS): 69 (Median farm size: 47 cows)

Paratuberculosis in Bavaria



Preliminary results

- **MAP detection (RT PCR and/or culture) in at least one sample:**
 - 13 farms (4,4%)**
 - RT PCR and culture: 4
 - Only culture: 2
 - Only RT PCR: 7
- **Prevalence in relation to farm subset:**
 - Convenience sample: 4,9 %
 - PraeMAP (RS): 2,9 %

Paratuberculosis in Bavaria

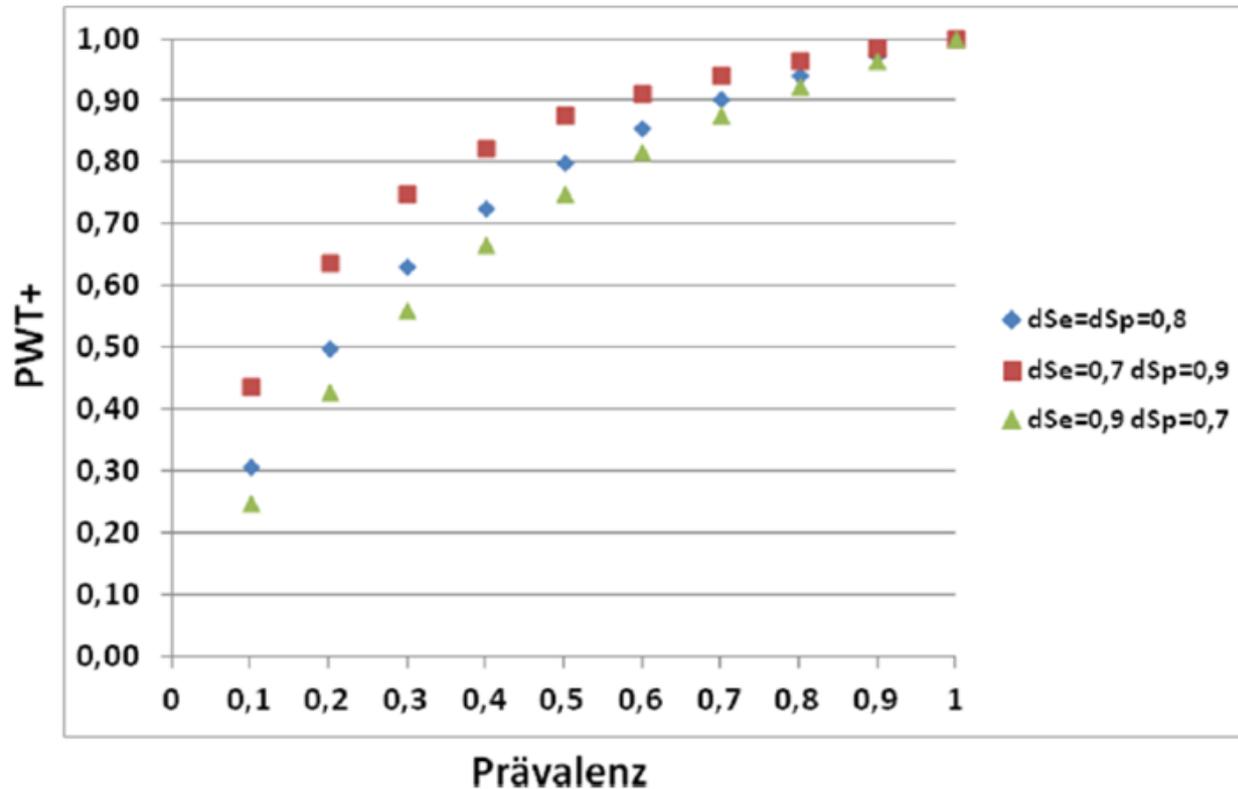


Preliminary results

- **Farm size positive/negative:**
 - **Median farm size positive: 90 cows**
 - **Median farm size negative: 60 cows**

- **Percentage of farms with German Fleckvieh or German Braunvieh only:**
 - **Positive: 42 %**
 - **Negative: 81 %**

Relationship between prevalence of a disease and positive predictive value of the test
